UNIT HISTORY MONTH OF DECEMBER 1944

On the morning of I December this battalion was still enroute from Auffay (M204474) to vicinity of Luneville (V1483) where the Division was to assemble and prepare material and personnel for committment on the Seventh Army front. Same date arrived at Baccarat Barracks (V2785) where preparation and maintenance was started.

Departed from Baccarat (V2785) on 5 December and moved into position vicinity of Waldhambach (Q6287). Battalion was attached to the 44th Infantry Division and reinforcing the 220th Field Artillery Battalion.

On 7 December the battalion was relieved from attached to the 44th Infantry Division and reverted to control of the 12th Armored Division.

A new CP was established outskirts of Rahling (Q622423) on 8 December and firing batteries moved into position to fire their first fire missions. During the day two battalion TOT missions were fired. Battery "A" fired harrassing missions throughout the night. On this date battalion was placed in direct support of Task Force, CC A.

On 10 December the battalion commander, Lt Col Harold M Crawford, flew his first combat mission and adjusted battalion fire on enemy artillery installations located in vicinity of Rohrbach (Q657499). Same date Battery "B" was displacing to a new position until 10 rounds of enemy artillery fire (believed to be 105mm) landed in selected position. Shell fragments hit the RO half-track. Alternate position was selected to complete move.

Another displacement of the battalion was accomplished on 12 December by moving to Rohrback (Q657499). From this position and at 2020 battalion fired their first rounds into Germany (Utweiler (Q683586) Germany, range 7600 yards).

Enemy harrassing fire, on 13 December, landed in battalion area killing one enlisted man from the 572 AAAW battalion, platoon of which was attached to this battalion. Same date battalion was placed in direct support of the 92d Reconnaissance Squadron, Mechanized.

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Unit History, Hq, 494th AFA Bn, Dec 44, Contd.

Results of propaganda projectiles fired on Eppingen, France, (Q695791) on 15 December were not found out.

On 17 December, 12th Armored Division, was relieved by the 80th Infantry Division. This battalion remained in position in direct support of the 714th Tank Battalion covering sector while change was made.

One ME 109 enemy aircraft flying over our position on 18 December afforded quite a target. A heavy barrage of ack-ack and machine gun fire chased the plane away from the area and firing only ceased when plane was lost in the low clouds.

This battalion released from 80th Infantry Division on 19 December and placed under control of CC B, 12th Armored Division still indirect support of 714th Tank Battalion. Battalion displaced to Hoelling (Q6852).

The Battery Commander of Battery "A", Captain Thomas E. Brassell, was slightly wounded in action (LWA) by shell fragments on 21 December while reconncitering for an alternate gun position in vicinity of Urbach, France (Q701557). He was evacuated through 82d Medical Battalion to 11th Evacuation Hospital.

The following report is extracted from paragraph 4, XV Corps Daily Artillery Periodic Report Number 89, dated 25 December: --

"The Corps Artillery Commander received the following memorandum from the 12th Armored Division Artillery: 'The capture of 28 prisoners north of Epping Urbach (695791) by the 494th Armored Field Artillery Battalion as a result of TOT time fire 21 December 1944 is called to your attention.

Enemy was observed in and around fox holes in the battalion sector from the battalion OP by the battalion Executive Officer and "C" Battery Commander, who was acting as Liaison Officer to the 714th Tank Battalion, also by the air observer who sent in a fire mission at 1127. Battalion TOT was fired, good effect noted, another volley followed, and third TOT brought a group running to our lines to surrender. Two more TOTs followed.

In addition to the 28 prisoners captured by the 494th Armored Field Artillery Battalion, 15 more ran to the 44th Infantry Division. Air observers counted 30 German killed outside their foxholes and an undetermined number killed or wounded in their holes. "

Battalion was still in position vicinity of Hoelling (Q6852) on 25 December. The morning dawned, cold and misty, and it was not until 1000 that the liaison plane was able to take to the air. Captain David A Hill, the observer, with 1st Lt Maurice L Glover, as his pilot, had been flying for several minutes when passing over Utweiler, Germany (Q683586) he spied an enemy horse-drawn artillery column on the road moving south into Peppenkum, Germany (Q673605). Captain Hill's ensuing adjustment succeeded in driving the artillery off the road leaving one peice abandoned in a ditch. Close observation of the same road and the houses dn north edge of Peppenkum (Q673605), revealed more German infantry and Captain Hill proceeded to fire successive concentrations up and down this read and to register with precision methods on houses known to contain Germans. Realizing that this large assemblage of Germans indicated a strong German counterattack, Captain Hill flashed all observed enemy actions to the battalion CP where the information was immediately relayed to higher units.

Another plane flown by 1st Lt Lester R Johnson with 2d Lt Herman F Nast as his observer, took to the air around moon to assist the other liaison plane, and allow it to gas up. These two officers took over the fires of the 494th Armored Field Artillery Battalion, while Captain Hill was given a battery of the 495th Armored Field Artillery Battalion. Equally important missions were adjusted by Lt Nast and further information reported on the mounting enemy activity.

The battalion departed from Hoelling (Q6852) and established its new CP at Zetting (Q5653), being placed in general support of 44th Infantry Division reinforcing 156th Field Artillery Battalion. A fourth firing battery was formed in the battalion, Battery "D" by making use of our three forward observer M-4 tanks. Battery "D" proved to be quite a success, after a few problems were cleared up, and they helped to reinforce our fire power.

During the period spent near the Saar River at Zetting (Q5653) information coming in regarding enemy activities increased to quite a tempo. From all these indications it definitely pointed toward an enemy attack which later was launched at midnight on the 31st of December.

The morale of this battalion showed in many ways that it was high. The more rounds the gun sections could throw out at the enemy and the more missions accomplished by both air and ground observers brought greater satisfaction inspite of fatigue.

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NARRATIVE UNIT HISTORY

At the beginning of this period the Battalion was reinforcing fires of the 156th Field Artillery Battalion, 44th Infantry Division, with the Battalion Command Post at Zetting, Q5653. On 1 January, between the hours 0001 to 0600, 1507 rounds were expended during an enemy counterattack. At 0642 Battery A fired the 10,000 round since the battalion had been in combat. By morning the counterattack, which was believed to be an attempt by the enemy to catch the American forces in a New Year's Eve celebrating mood, was repulsed and during the day enemy activity decreased.

Word was received from Seventh Army Headquarters, 2 January, that a coordinated attack was expected at 1200 along the entire Allied front. First signs of an attack came at dark (1800). The Battalion fired 7 TOT's, neutralization and destruction missions against elements of the enemy which had made penetrations along the 44th Infantry Division's sector.

During the period 3d to 6th of January, this Battalion continued firing against hostile elements including infantry in the open and in buildings and machine guns in the woods. Front lines were also marked with colored smoke for air support.

While working with the 253d Infantry Battalion, on 5 January, the Battalion Commander, Lt Col Harold M. Crawford and Battery Commander, Battery A, Captain Lawrence A. Gobeille, preceded I, K and L Companies into the town of Gros Rederching, Q6253, and took 4 prisoners of war.

The Battalion was relieved from the 44th Infantry Division to rejoin the 12th Armored Division the 7th of January. Departed from Zetting at 0830 and proceded through the Saverne Gap, Q7117, to assembly area at Mommenheim, Q9317. After arriving in area the Battalion was assigned the mission of direct support of Combat Command B, 12th Armored Division. Same afternoon the Battalion moved and occupied positions in vicinity of Weyersheim, R0513.

The Battalion Command Post moved to Bischwiller, R0918, still maintaining the same mission. During the day the Battalion inflicted enemy casualties by observed fire missions and destroyed enemy material in vicinity of Herrlisheim, R1214. As a result of intensive artillery fire of this Battalion and other artillery of the Division, the town of Herrlisheim blazed fiercely throughout the night. Corporal Robert W. Drescher, while accompanying 2d Lt Russell W. Hill, both of Battery B, was seriously wounded by an Artillery shell fragment dying of wounds received.

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The 9th and 10th the Battalion continued to support attacks on Herrlisheim. Battery Commander, Battery C, Captain James H. Moulder was wounded in action at Herrlisheim on 10th January and had to wait until darkness to be evacuated by light tank. During the day our air observers adjusted fires with good effect on infantry dug in and 88's, scoring direct hit on one 88.

The Battalion Command Post was moved to the northwest part of Bischwiller on 11th of January. Same date one platoon of tanks from the 714th Tank Battalion was attached to this Battalion for operations.

On the 13th of January 1st Lt Lester R. Johnson was slightly injured in a liaison plane crash. His motor cut off while taking off on an air mission. During the day most missions were adjusted by air observers, from the 493d and 495th Armored Field Artillery Battalions. E Troop, 92d Reconnaissance Squadron (8 assault guns) and Company A, 83d Chemical Battalion, less one platoon, was attached to this Battalion for reinforcement of fires and operations.

That afternoon the Battalion Commander, while acting as air observer, registered our Battalion, the 975th Field Artillery Battalion (155 howitzer) and 8 inch howitzer battalion from VI Corps. Commanding Officer registered the 975th Field Artillery Battalion on church steeple in Herrlisheim which was being used as an enemy observation post. Satisfactory results were not secured and request was made to adjust 8 inch howitzer on same target. Several direct hits were scored on the tower. Simultaneously tanks were observed in vicinity and fired on by 975th Field Artillery Battalion. Two tanks were destroyed but the church steeple was left standing but buring fiercely. A few hours later, the same afternoon, a report was received from VI Corps Sound Base that the church steeple finally collapsed.

On the 15th of January 2270 rounds were expended in harrassing missions, prepared concentrations against enemy activity and barrages.

Ist Lt Hugh Robinson, Battery C, was wounded in action by small arms fire and 2d Lt Herman F. Nast (air observer) was seriously wounded in action when a 20mm anti-aircraft shell hit the plane on the 16th of January. Our Battalion continued to support the infantry and tanks in the attack on Herrlisheim and succeeded in neutralizing anti-tank fire there. Estimated large number of enemy casualties and dead from our concentrations.

On the 17th of January, after a rather quiet night, we fired artillery preparations for an attack. Through out the day our Forward Observers adjusted fire to silence small arms and machine gun fire. During the evening the Battalion fired heavy smoke concentrations along grade crossing north of Herrlisheim to enable our troops, tanks and infantry to withdraw from sector and across the canal.

1st Lt Harry C. Walter was slightly wounded in action on 18th of January by enemy flak while observing from the air.

Battalion established new Command Post at Geudertheim, ROll3, 21 January. Battalion was placed in direct support of 4th Battalion, 143d Infantry Regiment, 36th Infantry Division, reinforcing fires of 133d Field Artillery Battalion.

Techinician Fifth Grade Calvin M. Cauley, while acting as a member of a liaison party on front lines, was killed in action by direct hit on half-track that he was driving on the 22d of January. Battery C received artillery fire in their position which resulted in killing two battery personnel and wounding eight.

The artillery of the 14th Armored Division relieved our artillery on 23 January and occupied our positions. The Battalion then displaced to Eckwersheim, Q9709, not going into firing position. Following day the Battalion displaced to positions in vicinity of Vendenheim, R9908.

New Command Post was established vicinity of Strasbourg, V9896, on the 25th of January. Battalion was put in direct support of 159th Infantry Regiment (French) and Alsace-Lorraine Brigade. From that period to the end of the month, mission remained unchanged.

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

NARRATIVE UNIT HISTORY

At the beginning of this period the battalion was in direct support of the 159th French Infantry Regiment and the Alsace-Lorraine Brigade, with the Battalion Command Post at Strasbourg (V9869).

On the night of 31 January 1945 a warning order was received from Division Artillery that the battalion is to be relieved from its present assignment between 2-3 January to rejoin the Division. Upon receipt of confirmed orders, billeting parties will be sent to Molsheim (V8293) to meet representative from G-3 and proceed to Division assembly area in vicinity of Selestat (V7862). While awaiting orders to displace the battalion continued to fire harrassing missions and on targets of opportunity reported by our observers. During the entire period 25 January to 4 February the enemy front lines remained the same in this sector with very little air and ground activity.

At 1000, 3 February battalion was relieved from its assignment. Departed 1300 from Strasbourg toward Rosenkrantz (7347) to meet billeting parties. After arriving at destination, battalion was placed in general support of the 12th Armored Division, under direct control of Division Artillery, and instructed to proceed to Colmar. Battalion cautioned against excessive land mines and booby traps in this sector.

Captain Albert M. Chandler and Private First Class Richard O. Moser hit a land mine on 4 February while returning from Division Artillery with S-2 information. Captain Chandler was seriously wounded and Pfc Moser was slightly injured. It was later learned that the Captain lost both legs.

let Lt Roger G. Bissmeyer (then 2d Lt) on the 3d of February, on a mission as forward observer with the 23d Tank Battalion, was forced to withdraw because of intense anti-tank and bazooka fire. Three tanks that preceded Lt Bissmeyer had been knocked out. Though the tank he was riding was hit by bazooka fire, it did little damage. Upon reaching the downward slope of a hill the tank over-ran enemy bazzoka positions. Fifteen enemy surrendered to Lt Bissmeyer and his crew, who, in turn turned them over to the members of the knocked out tanks.

The Battalion Command Post moved to Hattstatt (V6734) on 6 January. The same day a platoon of tanks from Troop "F", 92d Cav Ren Sqdn was attached for operations.







A radio message was intercepted at 0900, 4 February that the 4th Morroccan Division had previously met the elements of the 12th Armored Division in Rouffach (V6829) at 0530 thereby splitting the Colmar Pocket. The front line of organized enemy resistance was the east bank of the Ill River, but numerous groups of stragglers remained in the Vesges Mountains. At approximately 1100 this battalion moved to Rouffach with the mission of general support of the 28th Infantry Division. The progress of the French 5th Armored Division was so rapid the battalion was forbidden to fire between the Rhine Rhone Canal and the Rhine River. Air observer later reported that Neuf Brisach had been cleared of enemy and was occupied by French forces.

Operations order was received on 9 February ordering this battalion to rejoin the 12th Armored Division and prepare for operations in vicinity of Hundling (Q4556). Enroute to destination Battalion halted in Dieuze (Q2524) to spend the night. At 0800 the following morning the battalion continued the journey to occupy firing positions at Hundling with the mission of general support of 70th Infantry Division reinforcing fires of the 883d Field Artillery Battalion. Due to poor visibility the Corps Artillery Flash and Sound Base was used to register our Charlie Battery on a check point at Q508614.

During the period 14-16 February, this battalion was attached to the 44th Infantry Division, reinforcing fires of the 220th Field Artillery Battalion which was to support an attack to gain more favorable ground and also to straighten front lines. By morning of 16 February the enemy has been driven out and our lines restored to run generally east along the following coordinates: 2642560 - 2649563 - 2658560 - 2681570. After this mission was accomplished this battalion returned to the 70th Infantry Division in general support, reinforcing the fires of the 882d Field Artillery Battalion. New Command Post was established at Tenteling (24158).

On the 17th of February, after a rather quiet night, Battalion, participated in the firing of artillery preparations for an attack at H-20, time 0630-0650. Throughout the day this battalion fired unobserved missions on enemy infantry, battery of artillery, tanks and bridges. During the hours of darkness we continued with harrassing missions. The total number of rounds expended for the day was 1200.

The following day the battalion continued to support the attack of the 70th Infantry Division by firing prepared missions between 0645 and 0845. A counter attack by enemy tanks, and infantry was repulsed.

Battalion displaced to Bousbach (Q4261). Same date six 105mm assault guns from the 714th Tank Battalion were attached for operations.

Confirmed report received on 23 February that attached AAAW Platoon, from Battery "D", 572d AAAW, shot down one jet propelled German aircraft, ME 262 on 23 January 1945.





Between 2230 and 2250 on 24 February, 25 rounds of 170mm artillery fell in "B" Battery's position. No casualties were suffered, Enemy battery silenced by Corps Artillery.

From 24 February to the end of the month the mission was unchanged. The Battalion continued to fire on hostile forces, including infantry in the open, bridges, buildings, suspected OPs and artillery installations. Also neutralization and destructive missions against elements of the enemy which had made penetrations along the 70th Infantry Division's sector.

UNIT HISTORY NARRATIVE

At the beginning of this period the battalion was under control of XXI Corps in General Support of 70th Infantry Division reinforcing fires of the 882d Field Artillery Battalion, with the Battalion Command Post located at Bousbach, France (Q4261).

The first four days of the month the front lines remained relatively the same. The battalion fired primarily on targets of opportunity reported by our own air and ground observers. Harrassing missions were fired on call as requested by 882d Field Artillery Battalion. By the night of 5 March Forbach had been cleared of the enemy and slight gains made along the entire Division Front, but stiff resistance was being met in Stiring Wendel (Q3754). During the course of the day 1200 Russian Prisoners of War were released from a German PW camp as the enemy withdrew to Stiring Wendel and Sarrebrucken.

On 9 March 1945 a message was received from 12th Armored Division Artillery that battalion was relieved from present mission and placed under control of 12th Armored Division. Battalion to remain in position to reinforce fires of 17th Field Artillery Group along with the 495th Armored Field Artillery Battalion.

Battalion displaced by infiltration 1400, 12 March 1945, to occupy new positions in vicinity of Karlsbrun (Q3364). Battalion entered Germany for the first time upon completing this march. The same day Troop E, 92d Reconnaissance Squadron was attached for operations. Battalion was assigned mission of direct support of 17th Armored Infantry Battalion.

On 14 March battalion moved to Forbach, France (Q3857) and resumed support of 70th Infantry Division - reinforcing fires of 70th Infantry Division Artillery.

From 14 to 16 March observers reported that enemy was withdrawing but continued to fight a delaying action. By 1600, 14 March, enemy had withdrawn completely from Schoeneken (Q3958). In the meantime our troops had advanced to the Saar River at several points.

Verbal operations order was received at 0230, 17 March from 12th Armored Division Artillery alerting battalion for immediate move and also reverting this battalion to 12th Armored Division control. 12th Armored Division now assigned to XX Corps, 3d Army. This battalion to be in direct support of Combat Command "B". 12th Armored Division to go into assembly area near Bremich, Germany (U9484). Battalion alerted to displace at 0700 this date.

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New Command Post established at Elzange (U9586) on 17 March after road march of approximately 75 miles. This same evening battalion received orders to move to vicinity of Reinsfeld, Germany, (L3516) and march began at 2330. Reinsfeld was reached at 1400, 18 March, and Compat Command "B" immediately began the march toward the Rhine since the enemy was reported as rapidly falling back. Along our entire route the resistance was slight and totally disorganized. The Corps objective was changed from Worms (M4615) to Mannheim (R5599) on 19 March 1945.

For the first time during our thrust into Germany the battalion went into firing position in vicinity of Mehlingen Neukirchen (R0998) at 1300, 20 March.

At this point Combat Command "B" had encountered unexpectedly stiff resistance immediately south of the town of Enkenbach. Four Medium tanks were knocked out here by antitank fire. Enemy installation here consisted of numerous 20mm, 40mm and 88mm guns mounted for ground defense. Considerable stores of ammunition in the vicinity of these guns were fired on also. Personnel targets were numerous.

The German defenses at this point were evidently designed to block our advance to the Autobahn extending from Kaiserslautern to the Rhine. Ground observation for the battalion was furnished by Captain Lawrence A. Gobeille and Lieutenants Russell W. Hill and Roger G. Bissmeyer, who had succeeded in establishing themselves in a house on the outskirts of Enkenbach. Several houses in the vicinity of this OP were demolished by direct fire from the nearby German AT guns, but in the words of Lt Bissmeyer "they never did guess which house we were in". Both liaison planes also adjusted fire

The battalión occupied position rapidly and fired 700 rounds over a period of three hours. Effect was exceptionally good. All heavy personnel losses were inflicted on the enemy. Significantly, this was the first typically "armored artillery" action of the battalion.

After the Enkenbach action Combat Command "B" successfully bypassed all defenses of the Autobahn and arrived on the Superhighway
by a concealed route about dusk on the 20th of March. Progress was
now rapid - no resistance was encountered and elements of the Combat
Command reached the Rhine before daylight. This battalion occupied
position near Frankenthal, Germany (M4405). The following day the
mission of the battalion was changed to direct support 92d Reconnaissance Squadron which was assigned the mission of seizing the Rhine

SECTIVE

On the 22d of March enroute to Mutterstadt (R4593, the battalion column was strafed by four enemy aircraft; suffered one casualty. The following night at 2200 battalion was bombed for first time since entering combat. Three bombs dropped in Battery A position resulting in seven casualties. The battalion mission was changed to direct support of Combat Command "B" as of 1600, 22 March.

During the period 22 - 24 March enemy resistance stiffened with their main effort to fight a delaying action to withdraw their troops from Speyer (R8780) across the Rhine River. In his retreat the enemy blew up his ammunition stores and at 1030, 23 March, observers reported that the bridge at Speyer was blown.

After completing our mission at Speyer, battalion was instructed to proceed to assembly area at Hassloch (R3785). In Hassloch the battalion was billeted in civilian homes to await further orders for next operation.

The battalion was placed on a three hour alert on the 27th of March and instructed to establish liaison with the 714th Tank Battalion immediately.

Battalion marched from Hassloch at 2330, 27 March with mission of crossing the Rhine at Worms and later to proceed to assembly area at Lorsh (R6017) to refuel. As scheduled the battalion crossed the Rhine River at 0430, 28 March and continued toward Division objective (Amorbach, N0818).

For the remainder of the month the battalion continued its march with Combat Command "B", preceded by a tank force from 714th Tank Battalion. Some slight resistance was met enroute to our objective and the march column stopped only long enough to clear the opposition.

At the close of the period the column was halted because our advance elements met stubborn resistance in the town of Euerhausen (N5914) where enemy personnel armed with panzerfaust scored three hits on our tanks. Simultaneously enemy aircraft was active and dropped a bomb approximately 200 yards from the center of our column. No casualties suffered.



Throughout this period the battalion was attached to Combat Command B, and normally functioned in direct support of the two forces comprising the Combat Command - Force Fields (predominantly 714th Tank Battalion) and Force Norton (predominantly 56th Armored Infantry Battalion). At the beginning of the period Combat Command B was in assembly near Tauberbischofsheim (WN3915) under Corps control. On the night of 31 March this Battalion assumed direct support of Force Norton with mission of establishing a bridgehead across the Main River at Oschenfurt (WN6821) and to continue on to Kitzengen (N7429) enroute to Schweinfurt (N7637), the Division objective.

On 1 April, the Battalion was on the road proceeding east toward the Division objective. At 1530 the same day the Battalion was alerted for artillery support because of the numerous troops and vehicles that were observed to the immediate front in the vicinity of Randersacker (617312). All that afternoon and night the Battalion fired on the targets that impeded our advance. Air and ground observers reported the effect was exceptionally good. More advances were made by our forces during the latter part of the day, but the enemy succeeded in withdrawing the bulk of his forces across the Main River at Ochsenfurt. At 1650 the air observer reported that the bridge at Ochsenfurt was destroyed.

The following day the Command Post was moved to Tuckelhausen (N6530) to await the building of a bridge. By 0900 the 3d of April, a foot bridge was constructed and elements of the 56th Armored Infantry Battalion had crossed the Main River. The main body of Combat Command B met resistance east and north of the Main River. During the operation, our air observers worked with the 714th Tank Battalion and accounted for four tanks by adjusting artillery fire on them and forcing them to a position that enabled tankers to score direct hits. The observers did an excellent job of giving information as to the disposition of other enemy tanks and also the location of two 88mm guns in the sector which were both destroyed by the 714th Tank Battalion.

Verbal orders were received from Combat Command B on the 5th of May to execute Plan "w" which was to return the tankers from Kitzengen and proceed into Westheim (N6729) to clear out the pocket of German resistance. This Battalion, with abbached 937th Field Artillery Battalion (155mm howitzer), was assigned mission of direct support of 714th Tank Battalion during the attack.

The same day the attached Anti-Aircraft Platoon from Battery "D", 572 AAAW Battalion, shot down two ME 109s while protecting the bridge at Ochsenfurt.

From the 6th to 8th of April, our forces extended their bridgehead east of the Main River from Kitzengen, taking the town of Sickershausen (N7627). The Battalion occupied positions in vicinity of Michelfeld (N7625). During this period enemy aircraft were active, bombing and strafing the friendly elements to our immediate rear.





At Michelfeld the Battalion enjoyed a short rest period while Combat Command B remained in assembly at Mainbernheim (N8026). On 9 April the Battalion received orders to support an enveloping movement of the Combat Command designed to clear enemy forces from the area north, east and south of Mainbernheim. Rather than follow the fighting elements, it was decided to place the Battalion in a central position from which the attack could be supported at practically all points of the sweep, without displacing. Battalion displaced at 1800 to vicinity Einersheim (N8424) and registered to the north, east and south. Throughout the day and night the Battalion fired missions requested by both air and ground observers in towns of Hellmitzheim (NN8622), Tauerbach (NN8524), Castell (NN8926), Schonau (NN8621) and Stadt Schwargach (NN8620). Emergency barrages were prepared for "C" Battery's sector east and southwest of Castell. During this period 625 rounds were expended which included the 50,000th round fired since this Battalion entered combat. From this position the Battalion fired at ranges of from 1300 yards to 12,600 yards, and from due north to due south.

For the next six days the battalion continued its march in direct support of Combat Command B. Because of our rapid advance Troop "A", 92d Reconnaissance Squadron, was attached on several occasions for perimeter defense. On the night of 15 April an enemy patrol of six men tried to infiltrate our battalion position and were spotted by outposts of Troop "A" and fired upon with machine guns. The result was that two of the men were killed. It was later learned that the patrol's mission was to disrupt communications behind our lines. The dead had in their possession all types of demolitions and were armed with automatic weapons equipped with silencers.

At 1700, 17 April, "C" Battery of this battalion received counterbattery fire wounding one officer and three enlisted men.

The Battslion left Schwaighausen (WT2192) on 18 April and upon getting in position at Heilsbrunn (WT2187) three Royal Tiger Tanks opened up with direct fire from a range of 2400 yards east of town. "B" Battery was shifted and fired 13 rounds at the tanks with an air observer adjusting. No direct hits were observed but the tanks withdrew. Resistance was scattered throughout the remainder of the day and the Battalion continued its march to the outskirts of Ansbach (WT9883). In the meantime the remainder of the force occupied Ansbach against little opposition. In the process four 20mm guns and four 88mm guns were captured intact. The 88mm guns had opened fire on our tanks as they approached Ansbach, but had been spotted by our air observer and promptly taken under fire. It was learned from PWs that the crews were driven away by this fire.

The period of 20-21 April was devoted to cleaning vehicles and maintenance work because the Combat Command objective had been taken and they had no further mission. The Battalion remained in position however to cover the area south and west of Ansbach.

The Battalion moved to Deidenhofen (T0606) on the morning of the 22d. Very slight resistance was met during the day and two forces advanced to the Denube River. Enroute to the destination 600 Polish prisoners of war, who had been liberated, were seen going to the rear. During the march the battalion captured 157 prisoners in the town of Morslingen (WT0210).

Several enemy aircraft were fired on by the Battalion between 0630 - 0730 on the morning of 23 April. At one time three low flying ME 109s flew directly ever Headquarters Battery and one plane was knocked down by the battery's 50 caliber machine gun and attached anti-aircraft fire.



The following day the Battalion crossed the Danube River at 1430 and closed into position at Aislingen (YO193). Approximately 1830, six Stukas, JU 87s, Flew low over our position areas and dropped one bomb. No casualties or damage to material resulted.

The Battalion fired twenty five missions on 25 April, ten of which were in towns to the north and west of our positions in Burgau (X9785). Namely Offingen N9490), Rettenbach (X9378), Limbach (X9284) and also in the woods south of the Autobahn at (X9084). Offingen was the most outstanding of the series because it offered Force Tield the most resistance. It was taken under fire by this Battalion and later reported by the S-3 of Combat Command B, that as a result of our fires, 150 German personnel were found dead in the streets.

The Battalion received fire from rifle grenade from 0700 to 0900 on 26 April. A suspected observation post in the northeast edge of Burgau was neutralized by time fire and later a tank from the 714th Tank Battalion fired direct at the houses where enemy personnel were observed seeking shelter. All morning Head-quarters and "A" Batteries were harassed by small arms fire. The snipers accounted for six casualties — one man was killed before the snipers were silenced.

Combat Command B was relieved of its present assignment in this sector on 28 April and instructed to move south to an assembly area in vicinity of Langer-ringen (Y2454). The next two days were spend in firing at scattered targets reported by the forward observers. Enemy resistance was very slight and as the period terminated the Battalion was in position at the foot hills of the Bavarian Alps at Zell (WY6805).

NARRATIVE

During the period I May to 10 May 19%5, except for the first three days, the battalion was in the general vicinity of Eurgau (WX9785) - Aunaburg (WX8787) with the mission of occupying surrounding territory and acting as Security Police. On the let of May the battalion was in position at fell, Germany (WX6905) under control of Combat Command "E" with no definite mission other than waiting orders in the present position. There was no evidence of enemy action for the first three days, however the battalion fired its last round of 105mm howitzer amunition, which consisted of two rounds of emoke fired in adjustment of defensive fires by 1st L David T. Meston and 1st Lt Hugh Rebinson. The total number of rounds fired by this battalion since it entered combat is 57,59%. Feriod covered from 5 December 19%4 to 2 May 19%5. The following day a message was received that the battalion was to be attached to the 2d French Armored Division. A few hours later the orders were changed and the battalion moved 7.1 miles to vicinity of Benediktbeuern (WY7507). Upon completion of the march this battalion reverted to 12th Armored Division Artillery control. In the absence of any definite enemy action the enemy front lines could not be determined.

The battalion moved 101.3 miles on 5 May to Burgau, sight of a previous battle on 26 April 1945 and batteries took up the following positions: Head-quarters Battery — Eurgau, A Battery — Offingen (WX9490), B Battery — Unter Knoringen (WX9685), C Battery — Jettingen (WX0080) and Service Battery — Schoppach (WX0082). The mission of the battalion at this point was to occupy and patrol all the roads surrounding the battalion area. The boundaries to the north included all the towns up to the Danube River between Offingen and Dillingen. The border on the south extended from Thannhaussen to the Mindel River on the east.

The eventful day of 7 May 1945, the battelion received a message at 0946 from Division Artillery which read as follows: "A representative of the German High Command signed the unconditional surrender of all German Land, Sea and Air Forces in Europe to the Allied Expeditionary Forces and simultaneously to the Soviet High Command at 0140 hours Central European Pime, 7 May 1945, under which all forces will cease active operations at 00018 hours, 9 May 1945. Effective immediately all offensive operations by Allied Expeditionary Forces will cease and troops will remain in present positions".

Battalion remained in position during the remainder of the period, patroling the new area for reconnaissance assigned by 12th Armored Division Headquarters. Attached "B" Battery, 572d Anti-Aircraft Automatic Heapons Battalion relieved from attachment to this battalion on 9 May 1945 to return to parent unit.

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

NABRATIVE

During the period I August to 8 August 1945, the battalion was billeted in the vicinity of Steinheim, Germany (WS 7112) with Headquarters and Service Batteries in Steinheim; Able and Baker Batteries in Gerstetten, Germany (WS 6905); and Charlie Battery as a provisional trucking company in Aalen, Germany (WS 7329). Battalion duties consisted mainly of local security and roving patrol throughout the area.

On 9 August 1945 the Battalion displaced from vicinity of Steinheim to the vicinity of Neiderstotzingen, Germany (WS 8496) with Headquarters, Able and Service Batteries located in Neiderstotzingen; Baker and Charlie Batteries were located in Oberstotzingen, Germany (WS 8396). Duties continued local security and patrol as the battalion underwent a system of redeployement.

During the month transfers affecting all personnel of the battalion, present for duty, were made involving transfers to the 1st Armored Division, 3d Reinforcement Depot, to and from the 3d Armored Division and to the 7th Armored Division. Remaining assigned personnel were transferred to Battalion Headquarters. Iffective as of 2400, 29 August 1945, Headquarters, Able, Baker Charlie and Service Batteries and the Medical Detachment had no personnel assigned, attached unassigned, or attached from other organizations. The Battalion with 12 enlisted men attached from other organizations and 7 EM and 5 Officers assigned moved to the Division Artillery Area in Heidenheim, Germany (WS 7911) on 29 August 1945. Duties for the remainder of the month consisted mainly of local security and turning in of equipement.

Training for the month of August consisted of Information and Education Lectures, organized athletics and discussions of anti-sabotage.


